- 1. Hospitals: Teaching Hospitals in MI
 - 1.1. Sparrow Hospital
 - 1.2. McLaren Greater Lansing Hospital
- 2. Targets: foreign medical students as Internship
 - 2.1. 1 ~ 4 medical students (3rd or 4th year students based on a 6-year system)
 - 2.2. 2 ~ 4 healthcare professional students (2nd or 3rd year students)
- 3. Definition & Practice of Observership: a medical student from foreign countries will have a physician as the mentor during their rotation (8 hours/day, 8am 5pm, Mon-Fri).
 - 1.1. The medical student should check in on time to their mentor's office during their rotation.
 - 1.2. The medical student can't touch nor speak with any patients.
 - 1.3. The medical student should stay behind of a physician.
 - 1.4. The medical student will see how the physician will treat any patients.
 - 1.5. The medical student should attend all lectures and other medical academic sessions held in and by Sparrow recommended by mentors.
 - 1.6. The medical student should follow all activities of the physician/mentor's team during the rotation.
 - 1.7. The medical student should have his/her own health insurance, properly from MSU.
 - 1.8. The medical student might stay MSU on-campus.
 - 1.9. The medical student needs to provide their own transportation means for their commute for their own rotation.
 - 1.10. The medical student should not enter by her/himself to any wards.
 - 1.11. The medical student should not be involved in any kind of patient procedures.
 - 1.12. The medical student can check a vital sign of patients under the supervision of his/her physician as their mentor.
 - 1.13. The medical student will have a meal ticket during their rotation.
- 4. Fee of Observership:
 - 4.1. 4 weeks: \$3,000
 - 4.2. 8 weeks: \$5,500
- 5. Required Documents:
 - 5.1. Application form completed
 - 5.2. Current photo + valid ID: driver's license, passport + visa, green card
 - 5.3. Recommendation from the dean of your medical school
 - 5.4. C.V. or resume
 - 5.5. (Immunization record)
 - 5.6. Health insurance
- 6. Immunization Record:
 - 6.1. TB (Tuberculosis), at least clearance of TB
 - 6.2. DTP (Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis)
 - 6.3. Polio
 - 6.4. MMR (Measles, Mumps, Rubella)
 - 6.5. Hepatitis A & B
 - 6.6. Varicella (Chickenpox)
 - 6.7. COVID-19 vaccine (Vaccines approved by WHO such as Pfizer, Moderna, AstraZeneca, and Johnson & Johnson, etc.)
